Last night's Town Board Work Session was very brief. There were three items on the agenda and one appeared to be **TOP SECRET** as I had to move up to the front row to hear. This mysterious item was labeled simply: Blackberry Hill- Speed Bump. What I was able to pick up I've included in this Recap. What I really don't get about these short meetings is why other items don't make the agenda. We've been asking about the missing Historic Sites now for months. Special Districts need attention, a Senior Housing Moratorium was asked for - well, the list just goes on...

AGENDA:

1. Cable Agreement:

Kevin Bailey from Suscom asked the Town Board to accept a new resolution as RCN had been replaced by SusCom. The Board then asked various questions of Mr. Bailey ranging from 'long distance service' to the 'bundling' offered. Mr. Bailey said that hopefully new cable franchise would not make the same mistakes. Councilwoman Mitts asked if she was 'missing something'. It was then mentioned that the SusCom franchise is for sale. Councilman Johnson asked about the wide range in sound volume between different channels. Councilman Honeck said it was particularly bad between channels 49 to 69. Town Clerk Mazzei asked why we don't have an all local news channel like Westchester or Dutchess. Mr. Bailey mentioned that this is very expensive.

2. Blackberry Hill- Speed Bump

Editors Note: This was extremely difficult to hear so I will report as best I can:
It seems that since installing the speed bumps on Blackberry Drive (1999) traffic patterns have been changed to avoid them. Thus drivers are using Scott Lane. There was some discussion re. setting up a Public Hearing as had been done on the possible paving of Maple Road. Most Board members wanted to defer to Highway Superintendent Lawlor on this issue. Supervisor Dunford suggested that it not be discussed further. Councilman Johnson pointed out to Supervisor Dunford that the petition turned in was 'only' signed by 10% of the residents.

Councilwoman Mitts said she wasn't through discussing this issue and Mr. Bonanno said he thought she was.

3. Release of Performance Bond- Lyrics Corporation

A Board member (I think Supervisor Dunford) asked if they should have 'George Rohrman here in person or should we trust his signature'. That's all I could hear.
